this book draws together a number of major epidemiological studies of the cerebral palsies from many different countries the first chapter is a historical review by dr tom ingram who translated much of freud's original writings on cerebral palsy and is an acknowledged expert in this field the editors have then drawn together critical evidence from several countries on prenatal perinatal and postnatal risk factors contributing to cerebral palsy and have also considered the role played by social factors an excellent chapter by jonathan wigglesworth examines how these adverse factors may modify brain development and result in handicap to the child the methodological problems of classifying and counting the cerebral palsies and assessing their frequency are fully discussed and the difficult question of how far the perinatal health services have an impact on outcome is considered altogether this is a comprehensive book on this topic and an invaluable reference source for anyone working in the field of cerebral palsy or epidemiology

con rming the british genetic trait for writing and publishing as well as acting two english oxford and london and a scottish orthopaedic surgeon edinburgh have produced a third edition of their comprehensive text joined as in the second edition by an editor from germany recognizing its part in the european community the 62 physician contributors are drawn from pink colored countries in our childhood geography books the old british empire from australia to zambia and two from the former colony the usa

the original purpose of the book was to give residents or registrars an easily accessible and concise description of diseases and conditions encountered in the practice of paediatric orthopaedic surgery and to prepare for their examinations but the practicing orthopaedic surgeon will find an update of current practice that can be read for clarity and constraint enough but not too much a foreword might be a preview of things to come but a back word of what was thought to be the final say on the subject is needed for a perspective in progress a back word look reveals the tremendous progress in medical diagnosis and treatment of which paediatric orthopaedics and fracture care is a component clubfoot treatment based on the dictums of hiram kite has had a revolutionary change by ponseti the chapter by eastwood has the details on cast application and orthotics follow up to obtain the 95 correction without the extensive surgery many of us thought was needed

cerebral palsy poses multiple diagnostic and therapeutic dilemmas it is not only a medical and scientific issue but also one with many social ethical and economic implications with many contributions from top european specialists this book begins with chapters on the history and terminology classification incidence and prevalence etiology and neuropathology of cerebral palsy then diagnosis is covered with extensive chapters on the clinical characteristics of cp differential diagnosis and assessing with ultrasound mri and nuclear molecular imaging finally detailed chapters provide comprehensive information on the newest treatment modalities for cp including treatment with botulinum toxin dorsal rhizotomy intrathecal pharmacotherapy stereotactic operations and more the book closes with chapters considering the psychological and psychosocial aspects of the condition with its strong interdisciplinary foundation this book is certain to be a valuable addition to the library of pediatricians neurologists and others who may be involved in the care of patients with cerebral palsy

pursuing the dual goal of fostering an adaptive response and reducing a challenging behavior chapter seven refers to a computerized system focused on enabling a child with cp and intellectual delays with academic performance and communication opportunities whenever available the effects on indices of happiness and or positive participation were analyzed social validation procedures involving external raters were conducted practical features of the retained treatments were privileged clinical educational psychological and rehabilitative implications of the findings were systematically and critically discussed caregivers educators families of children with cp practitioners psychologists speech and occupational therapists medicine or psychology students and teachers may find some useful insights for both research and practice in daily life settings

the future is brighter then ever for children with cerebral palsy the most common developmental disability among young people today with advances in medicine early intervention and therapy these children can maximise their potential and lead healthy rewarding lives but perhaps the most important influence of all comes from parents who provide constant support and encouragement this is essential reading for all parents who want to learn about cerebral palsy and how it will affect their child and family

this textbook the second edition following the first published in 2009 provides a comprehensive and detailed analysis of all spastic forms of cerebral palsy examining each aspect of the condition from various perspectives such as motor perceptual and emotional in cerebral palsy rehabilitation the therapeutic approach should begin with an evaluation of the child s resources and the strategies they employ to build their adaptive functions despite their central and peripheral impairments the use of a pre established universal model of motor performance the so called typical motor development ordered by an obligatory sequence acquired in rigid and constant progression the so called milestones is no longer acceptable instead it is crucial to analyze the cognitive and motor resources of the child with cerebral palsy marked by the pathology regardless of any applied therapy to plan a tailored rehabilitation program with the child and their family this requires an understanding of how the child s brain responds to internal and external demands for adaptation for this reason it is necessary that the therapists acquire specific knowledge of the natural history of the form of cerebral palsy and its rules to design and pursue the most effective adaptive changes understood as stable and favorable modifications of the natural history achievable in that specific case and specific physical social and cultural context this approach should not only consider motor re education but also other therapeutic interventions such as drugs functional surgery orthoses aids and adaptive modifications of the environment this textbook enriched by clinical cases and videos will be of interest for those who already work in this field doctors child neuropsychiatrists and physiatrists rehabilitation therapists as well as for students of the first and second level degrees in the area of rehabilitation and specialization medical schools in this second edition all chapters have been updated and in some cases fully rewritten moreover in the new chapters the general concepts of cp re education the reasons that justify early treatment the importance of the active role of family the panorama of therapeutic tools the description of combined treatment re education drugs orthotics functional surgery and of assistive technologies were added
